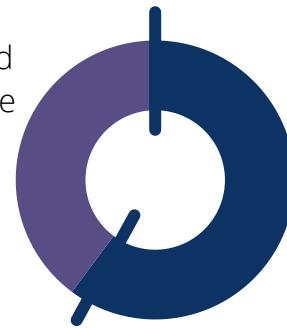

### WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A COLLISION INVOLVING 3 VEHICLES AND A SCHOOL BUS IN THE 1800 BLK OF W. MAIN ST. ON 4/20. INITIAL INFORMATION INDICATES THAT ALL FOUR VEHICLES WERE DRIVING EAST ON MAIN WHEN THE FRONT VEHICLE CAME TO A QUICK STOP AS THE TRAFFIC SIGNAL CHANGED AT MERCEDES DR. THE DRIVER OF THE SCHOOL BUS WAS UNABLE TO STOP IN TIME AND STRUCK THE VEHICLE IN FRONT OF THEM WHICH PUSHED THAT VEHICLE INTO THE OTHERS. MINOR INJURIES WERE REPORTED AND TREATED AT THE SCENE.
- NPD AND OTHER CITY DEPARTMENTS TEAMS WORKED TOGETHER TO ENSURE THE NORMAN MUSIC FESTIVAL WAS A SAFE EVENT FOR ALL. THIS ANNUAL EVENT REQUIRES STRATEGIC COORDINATION AND THE SUPPORT OF MORE THAN 25 OFFICERS, DISPATCHERS, AND SUPPORT STAFF FROM ACROSS THE AGENCY.
- NPD PACE UNIT COMPETED AGAINST NORMAN FIRE TO DEFEND THEIR CHAMPIONSHIP TITLE IN THE BIG BROTHERS BIG SISTERS BOWLING FOR KIDS SAKE COMPETITION. NPD WON 2 OF 3 GAMES TO BRING HOME A BACK-TO-BACK VICTORY. SGT ALLISON ALSO WON THE PIN PUNISHER AWARD FOR MOST STRIKES IN THE TOURNEY. NPD RAISED OVER \$1,000 IN DONATIONS FOR THE ORGANIZATION.
- NPD PARTICIPATED IN THE ANNUAL CLASH FOR A CAUSE FIRST RESPONDER FLAG FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT ON 4/25. NPD WAS ONE OF SEVEN CLEVELAND COUNTY PUBLIC SAFETY DEPARTMENTS THAT PARTICIPATED. A TOTAL OF MORE THAN \$12,000 WAS RAISED DURING THE CHARITY EVENT. BRIDGES OF MOORE WAS THIS YEAR'S BENEFICIARY.
- NORMAN ANIMAL WELFARE ADOPTED 10 ANIMALS INTO NEW HOMES AND REUNITED 9 PETS WITH THEIR OWNERS THIS WEEK. THE CENTER ALSO TOOK IN 68 NEW ANIMALS AND CURRENTLY HAS 145 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 36 OF THOSE ANIMALS IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
