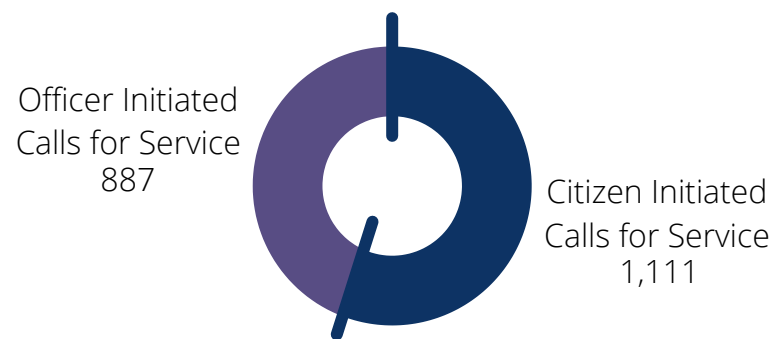

### WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RECENTLY HELD THE SECOND PROJECT AS PART OF OPERATION SAFE CAMPUS CORNER. THE EDUCATION AND ENFORCEMENT PROJECT RESULTED IN 9 ARRESTS AND CITATIONS FOR CHARGES RELATED TO PUBLIC INTOXICATION, POSSESSION OF A FAKE ID, AND MINOR IN POSSESSION OF ALCOHOL. THE ABLE COMMISSION ALSO ISSUED FOUR CITATIONS.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF SHOTS FIRED IN THE 2500 BLK OF W. BROOKS STREET ON 5/12. OFFICERS LOCATED MULTIPLE SHELL CASINGS, BUT NO VICTIMS WERE LOCATED. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION.
- THE SOUTH METRO SWAT TEAM CONDUCTED A WARRANT SERVICE IN THE AREA OF 24<sup>TH</sup> AVE AND ALAMEDA ON 5/15. ONE INDIVIDUAL WAS ARRESTED AND BOOKED INTO THE CLEVELAND COUNTY DETENTION CENTER ON A CHARGE OF THREATENING TO PERFORM AN ACT OF VIOLENCE.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED FOR A WELFARE CHECK ON 5/15 AT A RESIDENCE IN THE 2900 BLK OF OAK TREE AVE. OFFICERS FOUND A SUBJECT WHO WAS UNCONCIOUS, NOT BREATHING, AND CHOKING ON VOMIT. OFFICERS INITIATED CPR AND (ALONG WITH EMSSTAT) WERE ABLE TO GET A PULSE. THE INDIVIDUAL WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL FOR FURTHER TREATMENT.
- THE DEPARTMENT CELEBRATED OFFICERS, PROFESSIONAL STAFF, AND VOLUNTEERS AT THE ANNUAL AWARDS LUNCHEON ON 5/14. THE FOLLOWING AWARDS WERE PRESENTED: **OFFICER OF THE YEAR**-JONATHON JACKSON, **VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR**-AUBREY GIBSON, **COMMUNICATIONS OFFICER OF THE YEAR**-NICOLE PERSON, **PROFESSIONAL STAFF MEMBER OF THE YEAR**-DAVID RANDOLPH, AND **SUPERVISOR OF THE YEAR**-LT BARRY GRIPPEN.
- MEMBERS OF THE DEPARTMENT, CITY LEADERS, AND COMMUNITY MEMBERS GATHERED FOR THE NORMAN LAW ENFORCEMENT MEMORIAL ON 5/15 TO REMEMBER THE FALLEN AND HONOR THOSE WHO CONTINUE TO SERVE AS A CONCLUSION TO POLICE WEEK.
- NPD CELEBRATED THE PROMOTION OF SGT. MATT DEWALT TO LIEUTENANT ON 5/15. HE WILL SERVE IN THE PATROL DIVISION. WE LOOK FORWARD TO HIS CONTINUED LEADERSHIP AND CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT.
- ANIMAL WELFARE ADOPTED OUT 21 ANIMALS, REUNITED 10 WITH THEIR OWNERS, AND TRANSFERRED 4 TO RESCUES. THE SHELTER TOOK IN 56 NEW ANIMALS THIS WEEK AND CURRENTLY HAS 199 IN THEIR CARE WITH 84 OF THOSE IN THE CARE OF FOSTERS.
